FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS



Who can send comments in response to the consultation?

IDB Invest will accept comments from any individual or organization wishing to participate in the public consultation process, including clients, private-sector organizations, civil society organizations, communities impacted by development projects, government agencies, development institutions, donors, international financial institutions, academics, and research centers. Anonymous comments will not be considered.

How should the comments be sent?

The comments can be submitted in writing by registering for an account through IDB Invest's Public Consultation webpage [here](#). Once registered, you will receive news and updates on the consultation even before it is open for comments. The date the consultation opens will be announced to those with accounts and on IDB Invest's Public Consultation webpage.

In which language should I send my comments?

Comments can be sent in any of the four official languages of IDB Invest: Spanish, English, Portuguese, and French.

What is the deadline for sending comments?

Once the comment period opens, you will have 120 calendar days to comment. A timeline will soon be posted on IDB Invest's Public Consultation webpage with the specific dates on which the consultation will take place.

When and where will the in-person consultations take place?

A timeline will soon be posted on IDB Invest's Public Consultation webpage showing the dates, locations, agendas, and ways of participating in the in-person consultations, which will take place in Washington, D.C., Latin America, and the Caribbean.

How can I register for the in-person consultations?

You can register online from IDB Invest's Public Consultation webpage.

In person consultation will take into account: a) The need for diversity and balance in representation (by geography, stakeholder group and subgroup); b) The need to accommodate the number of participants in each consultation workshop; c) The opportunities for comment and dialogue available through the IDB Invest website and other channel and d) Expressions of interest in participating.

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Can anyone attend the in-person consultations?

The in-person consultations will have two formats:

Open forums for individuals and organizations wishing to participate.

Targeted meetings with certain key stakeholders, by invitation only.
